

THE TEXAS FREEZE

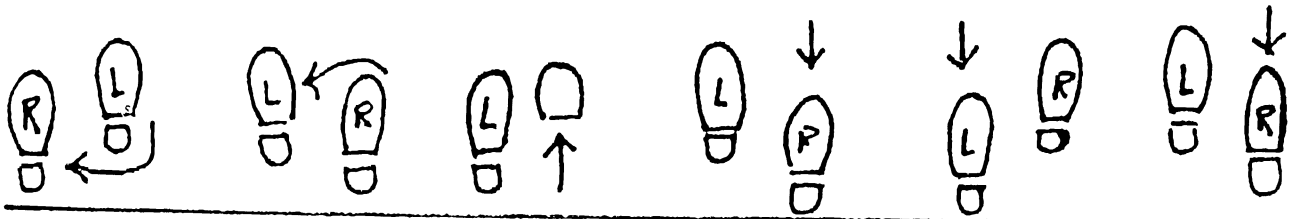

| 8 | Kick right | 16 | Kick right |

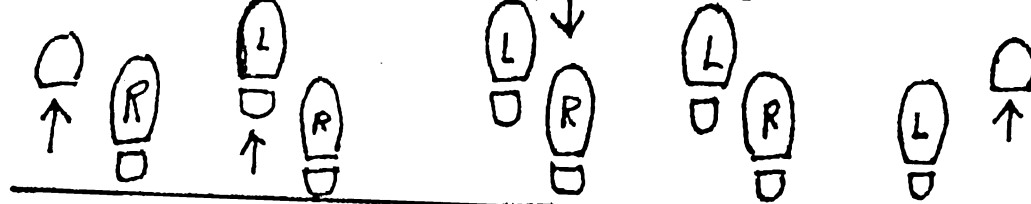
